Objectives	The aim of this course is to enhance the knowledge-based understanding in the field of modern Logistics & Supply Chain Management in order to support topic related decision making in a national/international setting.
Content	The course abroad should cover selected issues of the following fields of topics: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Logistics & Supply Chain Design • Logistics & Supply Chain Implementation • Logistics & Supply Chain Controlling • Logistics & Supply Chain Cooperation • ICT-application in Logistics & Supply Chain Management
Teaching Methods	Lectures, Case Study Work, Group Work, Presentations, Discussion, Workshops, and Business Games etc. (see course description of partner university).
Conditions of participation	Admission to the HHL MSc-Program; permission to take the sub-module abroad by both the responsible academic department of HHL and the exams council; permission by the partner university to take the course.
Application, combination and frequency	The course is part of the elective module “Logistics & Supply Chain Management” and can only be chosen in combination with all other courses of the module. The course will be offered abroad according to the schedule and time table of the partner university. The course has to be taken in term 5.
Conditions for Credit Points and grades	Credit Points are awarded for passing the module “Logistics & Supply Chain Management”. The module is passed if the weighted average of the single grades of the courses is 4.0 or better. Grades will be given according to the local grading scale of the partner university. The given grades will be transformed by HHL into the German grading system.
Workload	The course abroad accounts for 3 ECTS, which are equivalent to a total workload of 90 hours (including self study).
Duration	The course extends over one term.
